Last week, while pouring a concrete barrier on a new bridge deck on Interstate 5, a 2-inch hydraulic hose broke - spilling gallons of hydraulic oil onto the new bridge. With the fast reactions of my supervisor who was outside, we were able to contain the spill before it contaminated the pour. We used nearly everything in the kit (including the box) to contain the spill. The job was saved and my company was saved thousands of dollars. The concrete did not have to be torn out and replaced, and no fines or penalties for delaying the bridge's completion were levied against us.

The kit saved the job and paid for itself many times over that day. I'm glad we have the kits in our trucks.
