Will 2018 be a repeat of last year's record hurricane season?

Hurricane names are shockingly ordinary – Beryl, Chris, Debby. These are the first names on the list for the 2018 season. What's not ordinary is the destruction they cause.

Last year's season was the most expensive in U.S. history because of three hurricanes: Harvey (Houston), Maria and Irma (Florida, Puerto Rico, U.S. Virgin Islands). The estimated damage totaled more than \$200 billion, far surpassing the damage of even 2005's Hurricane Katrina, which cost an estimated \$108 billion at the time. Forecasters have already begun warning the U.S. to brace for more of the same this year. Several universities predict anywhere between 14 and 18 named storms on the eastern seaboard this year. The Weather Channel, meanwhile, is predicting 13 named storms and six hurricanes.

However you look at it, that's way above average. From 1950 through 2017 the average number of named storms had been 11.
