# There Are Serious Consequences to Just Waiting It Out

If water damage does end up affecting you and your home this Spring, you might be tempted to just let the water dry slowly over time. Although the water will evaporate eventually, it can cause damage if the process is not sped up.

Even small leaks can cause water-logged carpets that need to be professionally dried. In addition, leaks in your walls can cause rotting of both the drywall and the lumber used to hang the drywall.

# All Water is Not Created Equal

There are 3 distinct categories of water that can be involved in water damage, as outlined by the Institute of Inspection Cleaning and Restoration Certification, with category 3 including water that is potentially life destroying. Unfortunately, you can't tell just by looking at the water if it falls under category 1 and doesn't pose any health issues or if it is a classified as a dangerous category 3.

If they determine that the water that has damaged your home is dangerous they will take steps to ensure that it doesn't endanger your health by restricting access, destroying contaminants by the use of chemicals and throwing away contaminated items that cannot be saved.
